THE BARTON CREEK GREENBELT

http://bartoncreekhome.com/barton-creek-greenbelt-swimming-holes Part of the Edwards Aquifer recharge zone and the most beautiful urban natural area in the U.S. Greenbelt. Popular swimming spots include Sculpture Falls and Campbell's Hole. Water levels vary greatly depending upon recent rainfall. Access times are from Dawn until Dusk. Free of charge for access.

BULL CREEK PARK GREENBELT

Bull Creek Foundation has 32 square miles of ecologically unique terrain to tend and protect. Bull Creek watershed includes limestone seeps, springs, and waterways; scenic cliffs and waterfalls; interesting archaeological and cultural features and more. Located at 6958 Old Spicewood Springs Rd, Austin

BARTON SPRINGS POOL & BARKING SPRINGS

Zilker Park | www.austinparks.org/parks/barton-springs-pool/ Cool, clear, and teeming with life, this 1,100 foot-long spring-fed pool is one of the largest non-chlorinated swimming pools in the country. The pool is on average 68 degrees year round. Limited lifeguard staff on duty, swim at your own risk. Showers, restrooms, a snack bar, playground, picnic tables, and canoe rental are available. Outside the gates is a free of charge bark park and pool, where furry friends are welcome to wade. Check the website for entrance fees and hours of operation in Barton Springs Pool..

DEEP EDDY POOL

http://austintexas.gov/department/deep-eddy-pool A historic, man-made, but spring fed swimming pool in Austin, Texas. Deep Eddy is the oldest swimming pool in Texas and features a bathhouse built during the Depression era by the Works Progress Administration. The pool began as a swimming hole in the Colorado River, became a resort in the 1920s, and is today a popular swimming pool operated by the City of Austin.

ONION CREEK IN MCKINNEY FALLS STATE PARK

https://tpwd.texas.gov/state-parks/mckinney-falls Listen to Onion Creek flowing over limestone ledges and splashing into pools. There are two places to swim at the park: the Upper Falls and the Lower Falls. The park is located at 5808 McKinney Falls Pkwy, Austin.

Constant level lake with colder than usual water. The 1,830-acre Lower Colorado River Authority lake stretches 20 miles up the Colorado River from Tom Miller Dam to Mansfield Dam. The main access point for Lake Austin is under the Percy Pennybacker Bridge.

LAKE TRAVIS

The most popular of the Highland Lakes that stair-step up the Colorado River from Austin. Formed by Mansifeld Dam, it winds through steep, scenic hills for 65 miles with 270 miles of shoreline. More than a mile long with 24 floodgates, the dam is one of the largest masonry structures in the world. The Lower Colorado River Authority (LCRA) has eight primitive recreation areas on the upper end of Lake Travis. Four of the primitive parks require daily permits per day per vehicle and can be purchased at the honor boxes at the park entrance. Annual passes may be purchased at the LCRA, 3701 Lake Austin Blvd., or through the mail.

BLUE HOLE REGIONAL PARK, WIMBERLEY

This beloved pool is surrounded by 126 acres of natural forests and native grass fields that have so far escaped the developers' touch. Northeast of Wimberley off FM3237 past the church and cemetery.

HAMILTON POOL PRESERVE

This spring-fed pool is in a box canyon fed by a 45-foot waterfall with
a sandy beach and giant boulders. A nature trail follows Hamilton
Creek about a mile to the Pedernales River. Water quality is carefully
monitored. No glass, fishing, cooking, or pets are allowed in the park.
