5 Target Areas to Winterize Your Home

Inside The Home

Protect Your Pipes

• Wrap exposed pipes in insulation. If you don't have proper pipe insulation, a quick fix is to wrap the pipe in towels, cover with a plastic bag, and secure with a rubber band.

 Open cabinets under kitchen or bathroom sinks, especially on exterior walls of the home, to allow warm air within the house to circulate through the cabinet.

• Open both hot and hold taps slightly, to allow a steady drip of water from faucets. This aids in preventing the pipe from freezing, as well as minimizes damage by relieving pressure if the pipe does freeze.

Keep The Chill Out

Find any areas of your house that let in a draft. Usually, the culprits are windows, doors, air conditioning units, pet doors, and mail drops. Repair any large damage you find professionally. For smaller gaps, seal the areas by using caulk or weather stripping.

Outside The Home

Protect Your Yard

• Drain and disconnect your hoses

• Shut off and drain water from your irrigation system

• Insulate your hose bibs/ faucets using an outdoor faucet cover Bring potted plants indoors

 Insulate larger plants by covering with tents made from tarps or sheets

Gutter Maintenance

Icicles are pretty but they can tear off gutters, loosen shingles, and cause water to back up into your house.

Clogged gutters can easily get overwhelmed with ice, leading to ice dams. Before a freeze, remove dead leaves and dirt from your gutters so that melting water can drain away through the downspouts as intended.

Consider installing gutter guards, which will keep out debris in the future.
